

## 2017-18 Pupil Premium Impact Statement

*\*Please note the progress 8 figures are provisional until final validated data is released in January by the DfE.*

In summer 2018 there were 25 students in Y11 who were eligible for a pupil premium grant. Students are divided in to four tiers, based on their attendance and assessed levels of need.

Those students in tier 1 and 2 who had high attendance achieved highly across all areas, with a progress score that is significantly above the national average. These students also achieved highly across the Basics measure.

Out of our 25 PP students, 5 students had an overall progress 8 score of at least 1. This mean they made a grade or above more progress than other students nationally with the same KS2 starting point. The 5 students were from a range of starting points and included low, middle and high ability students. 4 out of the 5 students were boys, who made significant progress across English.

Nationally, there is a gender gap and particularly for disadvantaged students. However, the progress of our PP boys was above the national average of all boys.

The overall progress of our PP students was -0.041, which is in line with national averages.

All PP students studied a diverse curriculum with 80% of them filling the total A8/P8 elements available. This confirms their access to a broad and balanced curriculum. A further 4 filled all but 1 of the elements.

The chart below shows the spread of attainment of our pupil premium students at KS4 against their prior attainment at KS2. The 3 students with the lowest attainment 8 for their KS2 prior attainment group were the 3 students in tier 4.
